THE BENEFITS OF BEING GOOD

¹⁷ And if you call on the Father, who without partiality judges according to each one's work, conduct yourselves throughout the time of your stay here in fear; ¹⁸ knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, ¹⁹ but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot. ²⁰ He indeed was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you ²¹ who through Him believe in God, who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God. ²² Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart, ²³ having been born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever.

1 Peter 1:17-23

2.	IT	TO GOD'S GOODNESS:
	a.	Our lack of goodness separates us from God (1:18).
	b.	Our perfect Savior brought us back to God (1:19).
	c.	Our faith response puts us in Christ (Acts 2:38).
3.	IT	GOD'S GOODNESS TO OTHERS:
	a.	The goodness begins inside you (1:22).
	b.	This involves your justification and sanctification.
	c.	This makes the world a better place.
